Take a stroll through downtown Trenton to enjoy the events of the annual Downtown Christmas event on Friday, December 6th from 5:30 to 7:30pm.

The opening ceremony will begin at 5:30pm at Sesquicentennial Park. Jim Whitley will be the MC for the event. Opening prayer will be led by Pastor Don Jahrus. Then, one lucky child will win the opportunity to help Mayor Nick McHargue light the Christmas Tree.

Santa will be escorted by Jim Bush in the Trenton Cinema vehicle and a group of elves from the NCMC Baseball team. Along with visiting with the children, Santa will be available for pictures, taken by Bailey Studio. Parents can order picture packages through Bailey's if they choose to.

Other events for the evening will include the Ministerial Alliance reading the Christmas Story in the park area, carriage rides will be provided by Bill Hickebine, living window displays will be provided by Girl Scouts and NCMC, singing by the Pauley family, Trenton Middle School choir will be singing Christmas carols, Dockery Chapel youth will perform a live nativity scene, Bulldog Mascots will be mingling with the crowd, Super Stars Dancers will be performing in the Weldon building, a soup supper provided by the Masonic Lodge, fire trucks on display handing out goodies to children, cookie walk by Hodge Presbyterian Church, hot drinks provided by

Children's Advocacy Center & kettle corn by Chumbley's. Mr. & Mrs. Stilth will have their dog driving a small remote control car between the flag pole and traffic light beginning at 6:00pm.

Also on this evening, the Grundy County Museum will be open for visitors to view the festive decorations, a Christmas train with 150 feet of track, reindeer large enough for a child to sit on and several photo opportunities. The NCMC Intro to Theater class will be performing in the museum.


