

Tips From the Chief of Police

If you plan on driving during cold and adverse winter weather conditions, make sure you winterize your vehicle with fresh antifreeze, a good battery, a properly operating exhaust system and engine oil that will withstand the rigors of cold weather. You should perform a thorough pre-trip inspection of your vehicle, paying special attention to your tires, brakes, windshield wipers, windshield wiper fluid, and full tank of fuel.

Another consideration is a winter weather driving kit to include:

- A quality flashlight with extra batteries
- A fully stocked first-aid kit
- Necessary medications for all passengers
- Blankets and/or sleeping bags
- Extra mittens or gloves, socks, a warm cap and rain gear
- A sack of sand or cat litter to use for traction under your wheels
- A small foldable shovel
- Jumper / Booster cables
- Small tools such as pliers, an adjustable wrench, and screwdrivers
- A brightly colored cloth to use as a flag
- Nonperishable food items
- Several bottles water of water

Business Spotlight Trenton MFA



It's not often that we find a business that's been standing it's own ground since 1914 but that's exactly what you find in your local MFA. Dustin Cox, the manager of the Trenton location, shared an article with me that told a little of the backstory of how MFA came about! On March 10, 1914, in a one room schoolhouse near Brunswick, MO, seven farmers met to discuss an article in a magazine titled The Missouri Farmer. In this magazine, there was a call for formation of farm clubs. When these farmers read that, they soon placed the first cooperative order which included 1150 pounds of baler twine. They realized that by banding together for economic strength, members of the Newcomers Schoolhouse Farm Club could save \$400 in several group transactions. From that meeting emerged a cooperative that grew to become the largest business enterprise in the state and the one you all know at MFA. At your local MFA, you can find a wide variety of products needed all around the farm whether it be for pets, bailing hay, feed, crop needs, you name it and they probably have it! With that you can also find They sell both bulk and bagged feed as well as packaged chemicals, dry fertilizer, and all of your animal health supplies. If you need custom fertilizer or applications such as lime or chemical they can do that too. They even deliver your feed to keep you working while your feed is brought right to your door. If you aren't a farmer, that doesn't mean that MFA doesn't have anything you need, they also sell pellets for your smokers in a variety of flavor options as well as birdseed for your feathered friends and even deer food plot seed for the hunters. 


